Dear Friends

As we move out of the summer period into autumn, harvest is descending and we begin to see the landscape changing, with new colours appearing on the horizon.

Like the emergence of a new season, Children in Distress also moves into a new dawn.

This period of refresh is a great time for us all to take stock of where we are and for the charity to prepare for what we will deliver and achieve in 2024 and beyond. Although 2023 has had its challenges for the charity in Romania, with children being moved from our care to other provision, for the benefit of cost saving for the local authority, we continue to support and care for our lovely children at Casa Maria as well as wonderful new arrivals and continue to keep an eye on those who have moved.

2024 will see Children in Distress reach its next milestone 35th Anniversary, providing a significant point of reflection. A plan to build the future of the charity to ensure it continues to be relevant and focussed on raising funds to secure the future of more children in Romania through our three pillar projects – the Casa Maria home, the Arges Community outreach Project, and the Pineview Retreat Lodge, our vision for the next 35 years.

During my first six months as CEO have enabled me to develop and build on our long-term strategy to drive additional fundraising campaigns and events, social events to thank our supporters and the extension of our retail outlets into Scotland and growth of those in Yorkshire. We are exploring a new e-commerce offering (selling online), to reach many more customers/supporters with the generous donations throughout a wider geography.

The most significant change in 2024 will be the relocation of the Charity's head office back to Yorkshire, to centralise the support team in the UK in the heart

of our communities, so it is well placed to support all the UK nations as well as be on hand to the majority of our activity in Yorkshire, Teesside and County Durham.

So far two key events have been set for 2024, which you can read about in this issue of Vision. The celebration Gala in March in London which will include a silent auction, with gifts donated by wonderful people and businesses. Should you have any donations of auction items please contact our team with details.

Secondly, we have the celebration tour in Romania in September which will enable supporters, donors, and friends to come together and see first-hand the great work taking place in Romania.

I hope you enjoy reading about what is happening across the UK and Romania in this Vision and if you would like to offer any support, wisdom, or ideas in respect of our plans to grow the charity, please contact me or one of our Trustees, who would be pleased to hear from you.

I take this opportunity to thank you all for supporting our small by highly ambitious charity. As CEO and the Board of Trustees we will continue make important and impactful decisions to do what is right for the charity in order that we achieve a new level of success for the single benefit of providing for those children in Romania who rely on our care, compassion, and support.

Children in Distress UK is to relocate its head office to Yorkshire.

I am pleased to write today, on behalf of the Board of Trustees, about new developments at Children in Distress UK.

Following the appointment of Simon Errington as CEO earlier this year, in response to the Board's strategic direction, Simon has conducted a full review of the structure and operations of Children in Distress UK and has made his recommendations, which I am pleased to advise the Board has approved. I take this opportunity to thank Simon for his hard work and professional leadership during the last few months.

As you all know, 2024 will be a milestone year - the charity's 35th anniversary. Fundraising, growing the initiatives and activities as well as retail aspects of our shops, and increasing our community in England and Scotland sit at the heart of our strategy and business plan. There are visionary projects to deliver in Romania and ambitious targets to meet.

To meet these ambitions, the charity will be relocating its head office functions back to Yorkshire from November 2023, placing our operations at the heart of our charity community. Our CEO and financial function are based here, and we will be growing our team in the region, to provide administrative, fundraising and communication support for the head office. This shift will bring opportunities for new activities, events, and initiatives.

Our team in Scotland will focus on building its community focus through new projects, campaigns, and the potential for additional retail outlets and e-commerce initiatives.

I am pleased to advise that Lesleyann Connelly will lead the transformation of the charity hub in Scotland in the new role of Hub Manager, supported by Julian Dawydiak as a new Campaigns Assistant.



Our activities in London will continue to be supported by Hannah-Liisa Kirchin, our Partnerships and Projects Coordinator, whose role it is to organise events, campaigns, and drive sponsorship of activities in that region.

We will be recruiting for additional team members in Yorkshire including a Hub Manager for Yorkshire who will build the community focus in Yorkshire alongside the Shop Managers through new projects and campaigns as well as engaging with key support communities across England. To deliver the head office function in Yorkshire, a full-time Administrator will also be added to the team.

It is with heavy heart that I report that after eight years of invaluable service to the charity, Tina Connelly has decided to take this change in direction as an opportunity to explore new opportunities and will be leaving the charity on 3rd November with her last working day being the 2nd. We are very grateful to Tina for her hard work and dedication. We take this opportunity to wish her well in her new role, and I know that she will stay connected with many of you for many years to come.



SUMMER IN CID'S ARGES COMMUNITY PROJECTS



Children in Distress continues its great work in Arges County. With the aim of providing remedial education activities and art and crafts workshops to help the children resist their family pressure of dropping out of school to find work.

We host events at local schools, mostly focusing on giving the children a sense of empowerment.

In addition, our children are given a hot meal every day they come to the centre. We are proud of the following achievements:

- The children have improved their vocabulary, language and communication in Romanian;
- Developed their maths skills and analytical thinking;
- Their self-esteem and confidence in their own abilities has been strengthened.
- School attendance and performance have improved;
- Personal and classroom hygiene are given more attention;

We are very happy that these young people have made such progress in the short year since the program was started.







We had our second group of wonderful student volunteers from Loughborough University in England, come to Romania and volunteer with Children in Distress for 8 days!!





The volunteers began their journey at the Romexpo Ukrainian refugee centre in Bucharest. They spent 2 days sorting clothing donations to make it easier when distributing them to families in need. Throughout the process they showed so much compassion and engaged well with the people that they met and helped.

The students also worked with Rev Steven at the Ukrainian refugee day care centre, where they spent the morning preparing breakfast, playing games and attending a language class with all of the children, who were excited to meet some new friends!

They would spend their time holding the children's hands, reading them stories and building strong positive lasting memories for all of our children.







Throughout their visit, the students learned many things about Romanian culture and religion. We were able to hare some wonderful experiences together such as walks through the Old Town in Bucharest and visiting some of our iconic museums and churches.


