Children in Distress honours 30 years of caring for orphans, severally mentally and physically handicapped and often terminally ill children, and young people and children with HIV/AIDs, through several events in September and October. As we honour this work we remember the mission of CiD: to cure sometimes, to help often, to com-

fort always. This has been our motto for 30 years, and it continues as our goal today, 30 years into our journey of service and care.

CID will celebrate our 30 years with celebrations and thanksgivings in London and Romania, and a commemorative van drive of goods from England to Bucharest.

Anniversary Celebration and Thanksgiving in London



CiD hosts events 19-21 September in London. We will be joined by her HRH Princess Maria of Romania, the daughter of late King Michael of Romania. The Princess is the royal patron of CiD.

There are three celebrations planned in London:

Celebration Reception: A reception 19
September at Belgrave Square will feature a
welcome by His Excellency Dan Mihaloche,
Romanian Ambassadar to the Court of St.
James', speeches by Princess Maria and
Valentina Zaharia, CEO of CiD, and musical
offerings by sopranos Nelly Miriciaiu and
Hanna-Liisa Kirchen, accompanied by David
Gowland on piano. A reception follows.

Thanksgiving Service: 21 September

11.00, CiD will hold a service of Thanksgiving at the Romanian Orthodox parish of St. George the Martyr, held in St. Dunstan's in the West Church, 186a Fleet Street, London EC4A 2HR. The service will be led by Father Constantin Papescu. The service will follow the Orthodox tradition, including an Orthodox choir. The service will be followed by a light buffet lunch, and music. Everyone is invited to attend the Thanksgiving service and buffet. We hape you will join Princess Maria and other supporters for this special day.

Luncheon: Later in the afternoon of 21 September, CiD will host a lunch for Princess Maria, Ambassador Miholache, other officials, CiD's board and key supporters.



Thanksgiving Tour: Once again CiD offers the annual Thanksaiving tour in Romania: the tour is a way to get to know our supporters and celebrate them by showing them special places in Romania as well as the CID hospices and afterschool center. The tour this year is 30 September-6 October, We will visit the Fortress of Fagoras, Sambata de Sus Monastery, Cluj, Alba Julia, Transfagarosean Road (reputedly one of the most beautiful travels in the world), St. Christopher's afterschool center in Curtea de Arges, St. Andrew's hospice in Pitesti and St. Margaret's hospice in Bucharest. 42 supporters have signed up, from England, Scotland, Germany and Romania.

Thanksgiving Service: The highlights of the Thanksgiving tour will happen October 5. We begin the day with a Thanksgiving service, 13.00, at the Anglican Church of the Resurrection in Bucharest. The service will follow the Anglican tradition. The Rt Rev Mark D. W. Edington, Bishop of the Anglican/Episcopal Churches in Europe, is scheduled to preside, and the Rev Steven Smith, an Anglican/Episcopal priest in Bucharest, will preach. October 5 is Eddie Errington's birthday (see the following article about Eddie's commitment to CiD), and the service will include a special prayer in memory of, and thanks for, Eddie. Every one is invited to the service.

Gala Dinner: The other highlight October 5 is a gala dinner at the Capital Plaza Hotel. The supporters depart for home October 6.



September Drive Out in Eddie Errington's Memory

We are today 30 years later since Rev Dr John Walmsley, CID's founder, organized the first convoys with goods to come to Romania. Rev Dr Walmsley acted in response to the horrific news that the world learned about undressed, hungry and dirty children who had been kept in Romanian orphanages during the Ceauscu dictatorship, many of whom had HIV/AIDS and other debilitating conditions.

We plan to recreate the first mercy mission convoys in memory of Eddie Errington, who participated in the first convoy of trucks that left the UK in 1989/1990. We hope also to raise funds through the reenactment of the first convoys for CiD's ongoing ministry to children in difficulty and need.

Eddie was a true unsung hero, loyal until the end to "his children ". In his later years, Eddie also collected many Christmas shoe boxes for transport to Romania, Eddie never sought praise or adoration. His reward was the smiles and love of the children and people of Romania.

John Burns and Bryn Code, two of our sup-

porters from England (John is also a Board Trustee) will drive a van of winter goods, departing the UK in late September and arriving in Bucharest in early October to coincide with CiD's 30th anniversary celebrations. John and Bryn have been ably supported by Roy Wheeler, who has arranged transport at friendly prices, just has he has done for years in moving Christmas shoe boxes from the UK to Romania.

It would be fantastic if you would be able to support us in this venture in memory of Eddie. We are looking for donors to cover the cost of the fuel, ferries and expenses of the van, which is estimated to be £2,800. An Interview with Trustee Anne-Marie Martin

Trustee Anne-Marie Martin recently was interviewed by the London School of Business & Finance.
We quote:



Anne-Marie Martin currently holds the position of Director of Global Business Networks at the British Chambers of Commerce. Here she speaks to the London School of Business & Finance about the importance of achieving greater gender balance in the workplace and the fundamentals of being a successful director.

What makes Anne-Marie stand out as a business person is her global outlook. As a first generation migrant from Romania, Anne-Marie feels connected to her country of origin and has moulded her career to be based not only in the UK, but also abroad in Central and Eastern Europe. Notably, she worked for an extensive period of time as the CEO of the British Romanian Chamber of Commerce, a role which helps to strengthen the business relationship between Romania and the UK. Her view is that we live in a glo-

balised world and it is important to understand the nuances of how each country conducts business.

As well as emphasing that business people should develop an understanding of how different business cultures operate, Anne-Marie also advocates placing more women in senior manager rales. Despite being on the verge of a technological revolution, the issue of gender inequality in the workplace is still a high ranking priority for many businesses. Anne-Marie states if we are still discussing the issue, 'we haven't got it right'. Therefore, in order to achieve a greater balance, she believes governments need to bring in legislation. She sees this as the way to drive change and argues that in addition, businesses themselves should work together to create an environment in which this change can take place.

During her career, Anne-Marie has undertaken several directorships evidencing that she knows what it takes to be successful in a senior position. The skills she highlights as being paramount to success are excellent communication, the ability to thinking strategically and commerciality. She again focusses on the importance of having a global outlook stating that social and cultural understanding between countries is "imperative".

The discussion concludes with some thoughts about what the future of the business world looks like. Anne-Marie highlights there are already fintech solutions in place to assist businesses in making them more efficient and managing risk. However, the world is fast-paced and always changing. Therefore, it is important that we continuously educate ourselves."
