Children in Distress (CID) is a UK-based charity dedicated to improving the lives of vulnerable children in Romania. Established in 1990, our mission is to provide comprehensive care and support to children facing severe health challenges, social deprivation and educational disadvantages. Over the past three decades, Children in Distress has become a beacon of hope for countless children and their families, offering a lifeline in times of dire need and empowering them to build better futures.

Our work is driven by a deep commitment to the wellbeing of children, ensuring that they receive the medical care, education and emotional support necessary to thrive despite their circumstances. From its humble beginnings, Children in Distress has grown into a multifaceted organisation, with a range of programmes designed to address the complex and varied needs of the children we serve. The programmes include specialised medical treatments, educational initiatives, social services and community outreach, all tailored to create a holistic support system delivered by our sister charity Copii in Dificultate.

The year 2023 has been a pivotal one for Children in Distress during which we restructured the charity and streamlined the systems and processes to support the delivery of our work across the UK. Our approach to holistic care involves providing the following through Copii in Dificultate:

Medical Support: Providing specialised treatments and ongoing medical care to children with severe health conditions, ensuring they receive the best possible healthcare regardless of their financial situation.

Educational Opportunities: Offering educational programmes and resources to children who are deprived of quality education, helping them to achieve academic success and unlock their potential.

Social Services: Addressing the social and emotional needs of children by providing counselling, social activities and support networks that help them integrate into society and build self-confidence.

Community Engagement: Working closely with local communities to create supportive environments that nurture the growth and development of children, as well as advocating for policies that protect their rights and wellbeing.

Through these efforts, we strive to create a nurturing environment where children can overcome their hardships and flourish.

Vision:

A world where every child, regardless of their circumstances, can thrive and reach their full potential.

Our vision is an ambitious one, but it reflects our unwavering commitment to the children we serve. We envision a future where every child, no matter their background or the obstacles they face, has the chance to grow up healthy, educated and empowered. In this ideal world, children are free from the constraints of poverty, illness and social exclusion and can pursue their dreams and aspirations.

Sustainability: Building sustainable programmes that provide long-term solutions to the challenges faced by children thereby ensuring that our impact continues to grow and evolve with the needs of the community.

4. Programmes and Activities

Casa Maria

To provide a family environment with specialist care for children with complex needs.

Outcomes

- A safe home for 12 children with specialist care
- Continued therapies to help children with mobility, nutritional needs and education
- A centre of specialist care for children with complex disabilities



Our Community Education Outreach programme for students at risk of school dropout from disadvantaged rural areas is designed with a clear purpose: to break down barriers to education and ensure that children from socioeconomically disadvantaged families can complete their compulsory schooling.

Outcomes

- Through a range of activities, we strive to support these children in their academic endeavours and provide them with essential protective skills and habits for both physical and emotional wellbeing.
- Recognising the importance of health education, we provide informative sessions covering various aspects of health, including hygiene, self-care and nutrition.
- Our programme targets children from families facing unemployment, unstable employment and financial hardship, where low educational levels and other challenges may further exacerbate the risk of school dropout.



Zarnesti Pineview Retreat Lodge

Our vision for the future is to create a respite space that will encourage social integration of children and young people of mixed abilities whilst providing rest for the children with complex disabilities, parents and carers.

Outcomes

- Work continues on the process of obtaining preliminary authorisations for construction.
- Partial electrical connection approval has been obtained. A coexistence study has been commissioned to an authorised company in order to obtain the final approval.

A family home offering support for children with complex neurological, physical and emotional needs.

Provided care to over 4,000 children from disadvantaged communities.

Delivered support services to over 100 children and organised several community events.

8. Challenges and Future Goals

Challenges:

In 2023, several key obstacles have significantly impacted our operations:

Funding Constraints: Ensuring consistent funding remains a significant challenge. While we are fortunate to have a dedicated base of donors, fluctuations in economic conditions, donor fatigue and increased competition for charitable donations can make it difficult to secure the necessary resources. This unpredictability affects our ability to plan long-term and expand our programmes.

Regulatory Challenges: Navigating the regulatory landscape in both the UK and Romania can be complex and time-consuming.

Changes in laws and policies related to healthcare, education and non-profit operations can introduce new hurdles that require significant administrative effort and adaptation.

Volunteer Recruitment and Retention: While our volunteers are indispensable, recruiting and retaining committed individuals can be challenging. Many potential volunteers face their own constraints that can affect their ability to contribute consistently.

Technological Adaptation: Keeping pace with technological advancements is essential for efficient operations and effective service delivery. However, implementing new technologies requires investment and training, which can be difficult to manage alongside our other financial constraints.



8. Challenges and Future Goals

Future Goals

Despite these challenges, we are steadfast in our commitment to our mission and optimistic about the future. Our goals for the coming years are focused on enhancing our impact and ensuring sustainable growth:

Expand Funding Sources: To address funding constraints, we aim to diversify our revenue streams. This includes pursuing grants from foundations, forging partnerships with corporate sponsors and launching new fundraising campaigns. We will also explore innovative funding models, such as social enterprise initiatives, that can generate ongoing income.

Optimise Operational Efficiency: To combat rising operational costs, we will focus on optimising our processes and improving costefficiency. This includes negotiating better rates for supplies, leveraging bulk purchasing agreements and exploring alternative suppliers. We also plan to invest in staff training to enhance skills and productivity.

Strengthen Regulatory Compliance: We will enhance our regulatory compliance capabilities by investing in robust administrative systems and training our staff on new and existing regulations. This will ensure that we remain compliant and can swiftly adapt to any changes in the legal landscape.

Enhance Volunteer Programmes: To improve volunteer recruitment and retention, we will develop more comprehensive support and training programmes. This includes offering flexible volunteering options, providing regular feedback and recognition, and creating opportunities for personal and professional development.

Leverage Technology: Embracing technology will be a key focus. We plan to implement advanced data management systems to better track our impact, streamline our operations and improve communication with stakeholders.

Expand Programme Reach: We aim to extend our programmes to more regions within Romania through Copii in Dificultate as well as exploring the building of partnerships with other local organisations and communities.
